*BSR/GBI 01-202X: Assessment Protocol for Design, New Construction, and Major Renovations is now accepting public comments until January 12, 2026*

The standard includes criteria and practices for resource-efficient, healthy, resilient, and environmentally preferable new construction of commercial buildings.
